[What to Bring

Lunch: Campers should bring a sack lunch and extra drinks. A cooler will be provided to store the lunches and drinks. Bottles of water are recommended.

Apparel: Bicycle helmets are acceptable for the Beginner Campers, all other levels should have a safety approved equestrian riding helmet. All riders must wear long pants and hard soled shoes or boots with a 1/2 inch or 3/4 inch heel. NO SHORTS OR GYM SHOES WILL BE PERMITTED. Also, for your campers safety please no hiking boots. Please provide your own sunscreen.



Cost and Registration Process

Price of each camp week is \$375.00. KEC is often booked months in advance of the summer sessions; please make your reservations early.

A NON-REFUNDABLE deposit of \$100.00, which is applied to the cost of camp, is due upon registration. A space cannot be reserved without a deposit. Final balance will be due the first day of camp. You will receive an e-mail confirmation notice shortly after registration materials are received at KEC.



Cancellations and Medications

No Refunds or Credits will be issued.

There are no make ups for missed days during a camp session week.

Medications CANNOT be administered by any member of KEC staff for any medical reason. This is why it is imperative to have all emergency numbers available.

Levels of Riding

Beginner: Never Ridden/Walk/Trot only. This level includes previous beginner campers who do not ride consistently and children just learning about horses.

Intermediate Beginner: Walk/Trot learn to Canter. This level is for riders who participate all year long in lessons and horse related activities. Campers will work on their form and technique in the saddle on the flat.

Intermediate: Walk/Trot/Canter with an introduction to jumping.

Each level will participate in two riding lessons per day. The campers will also learn barn management, horse management and equipment maintenance. Beginner and Intermediate campers will participate in making some crafts as well as playing mounted horseback games. All camp levels will receive a certificate and a t-shirt.
